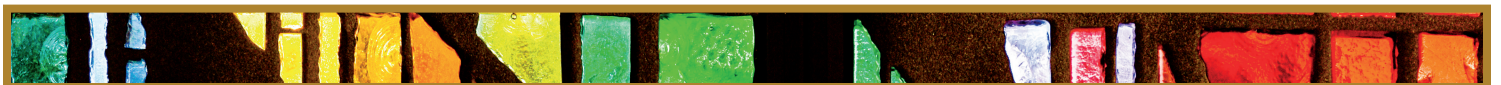
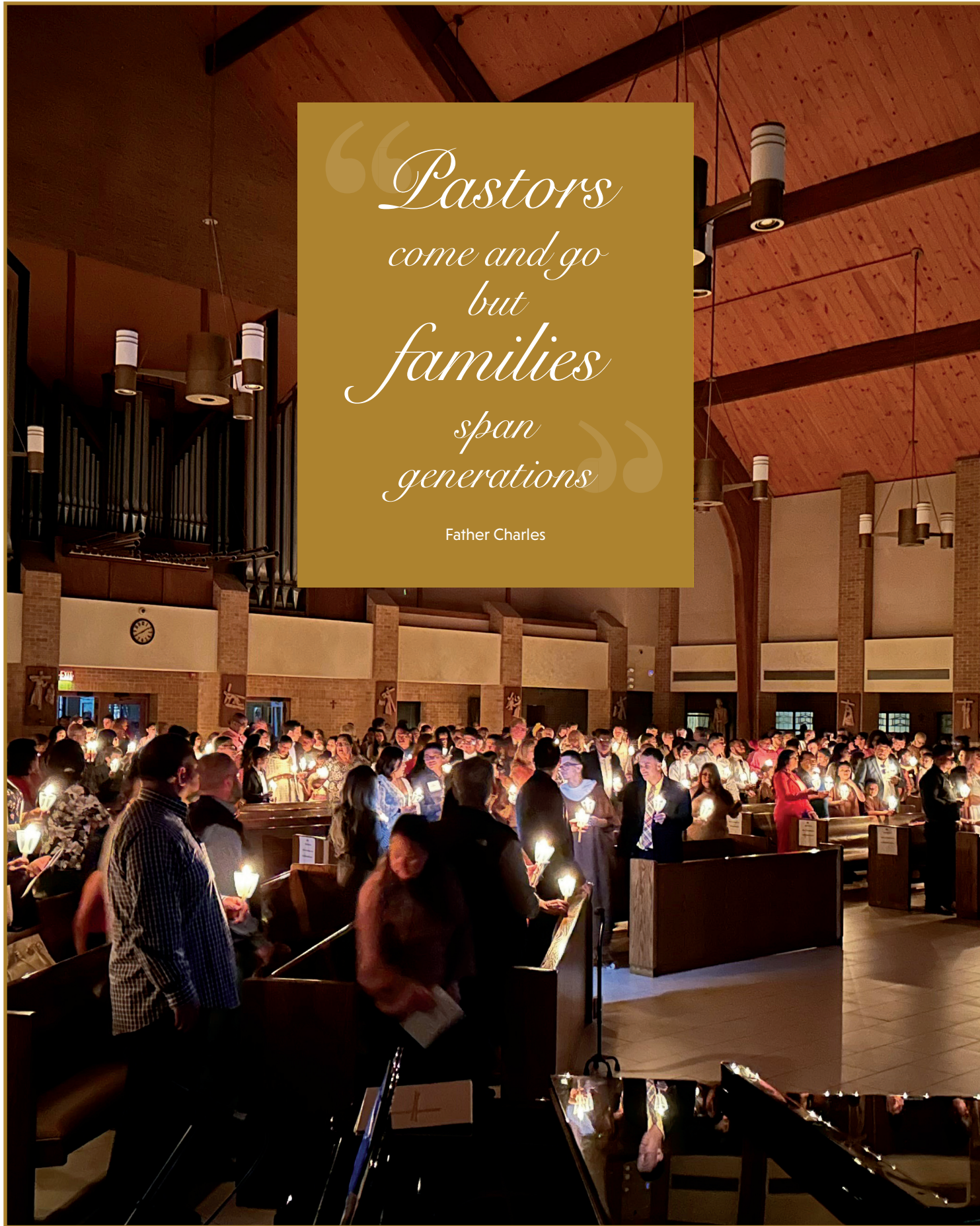

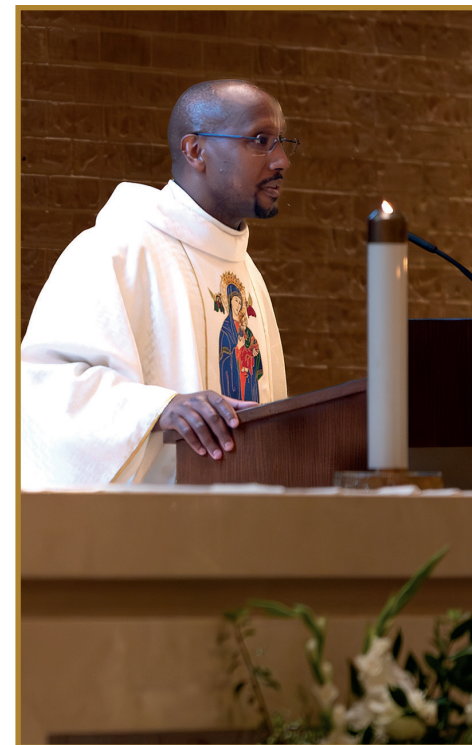

For 60 years, people have found a welcoming home at St. Patrick Catholic Community. Fr. Charles reminds us, “Pastors come and go, but families span generations.” Each generation has been a “... faithful steward of God’s grace ...” handing on the gift of faith (1 Peter 4:10).

The recent Parish survey served as the collective voice of parishioners young and old. More than a third of our 1,700 families completed the survey, giving the Pastor and lay leadership clear direction concerning priorities.

Parishioners felt the Eucharist should be at the center of everything we do. They appreciated the many ministries, and wanted additional meeting space. They care deeply about their children’s education and formation, and understand that the School is a critical ministry of St. Patrick Catholic Community. Over 200 people added additional comments, in which one finds a good dose of common sense. Parishioners felt we first needed to maintain existing buildings, to protect the previous generation’s investment.

Having read the survey report and comments, the Pastor met with the Finance Council on December 13 to determine the final scope of projects for a Capital Campaign. In consultation with all parishioner input and in consultation with the Finance Council, the School Principal, and representatives of the Parish Council and the School Advisory Council, the Pastor approved the final scope of projects for a Capital Campaign of \$2,767,000 for the listed projects.



As we continue to celebrate 60 years of God’s Blessing since this parish was founded, I want from the depths of my heart to give thanks to God for all the founding members of this parish—those still with us and those who have gone to heaven—for their generosity, their sweat, and their sacrifices as they built this community. Why did they do it? They did it for you and for me. They did it for the good of generations to come.

St. Patrick 60th Anniversary Capital Campaign is an opportunity for us to express our gratitude for the gift of faith that has been passed down to us. It is an opportunity to ask ourselves, do we, like our founding members, use every means to pass on this faith to the next generation?

As you prayerfully consider your pledge to the campaign, be assured of my prayers and I thank you for your generosity.

CAMPAIGN PROJECTS

Project	Budget	Background
Re-roof the Sanctuary	\$525,000	Roof and bell tower repairs protect against water infiltration of the interior. Gutters protect the Church by moving water away from the foundation.
Bell Tower Repairs	250,000	
Gutters	43,000	
School Exterior Sealing	145,000	Brick walls have space every 20 feet or so for expansion joints filled with flexible material. This allows for expansion and contraction caused by heat and cold. The original 1963 sealant has decayed. Resealing is needed to avoid the risk of water infiltration.
Men's/Women's Bathrooms in Gym	300,000	Designated restrooms for adults and children are essential for Safe Environment standards. Separate men and boys' restrooms/lockers will be on the west side of the gym. All women's facilities will be on the east side. With all male facilities on one end, and all female facilities on the other, it is easier to monitor traffic flow.
Main Floor Restrooms in School	125,000	Due to the central location, Main floor restrooms are used most often by School families and the various groups who use the School building. In addition to flooring and tile, restrooms will be made ADA compliant.
AC/lighting/walkway	210,000	AC upgrades and repairs to the walkway are needed. Light fixtures in the church would remain the same, with upgrades in ballast and LED bulbs to reduce operating costs.
Sound	30,000	The sound system does not need to be replaced. Rather, certain amplification components need to be upgraded.
Remodel 9521 Lynngrove Drive to create new rectory	250,000	In November, St. Patrick purchased the house at 9521 Lynngrove Drive, directly across the street from the Parish Center. Twenty-four donors contributed a total of \$554,750, enough to cover the purchase and closing costs. The Lynngrove property will become the new rectory. The current rectory will be reconfigured into offices, and existing offices into meeting rooms.
Create office space in existing rectory.	350,000	
Reconfigure Existing Parish Offices into Meeting Rooms.	285,000	
Upper Playground	229,000	The upper playground is used six hours a day by Pre-K through 2nd grade children, and at other times by parish families and neighbors. Equipment will be age appropriate.
Parish Center Improvements	25,000	In the survey, many parishioners remarked on the importance of a welcoming gathering space for our many ministries. The budget would freshen up flooring and chairs.

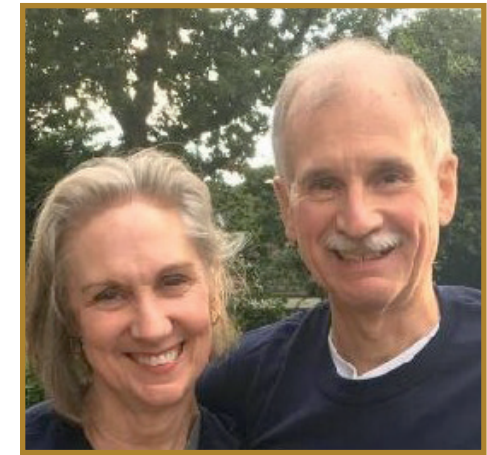

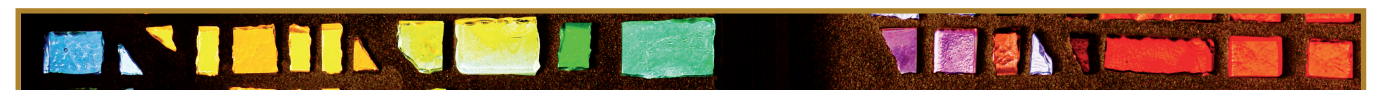

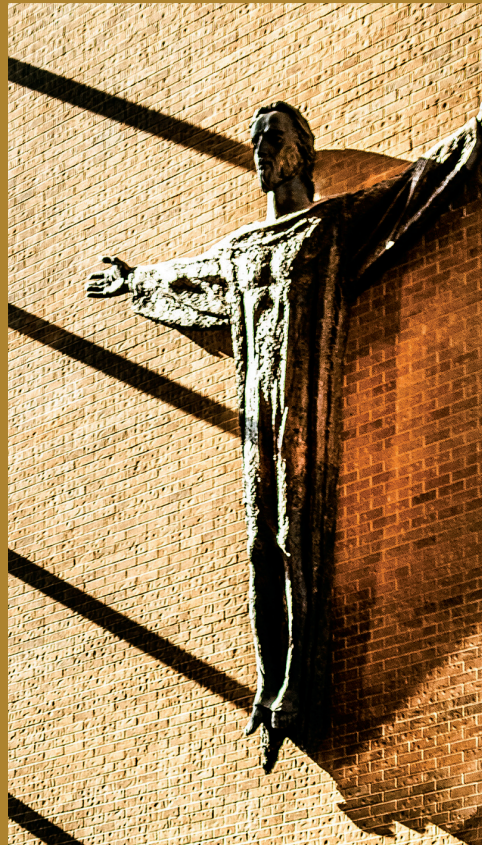
